

RECYCLING GUIDE FOR GLASSES

PREPARATION FOR RECYCLING



- 1** Identify the local bottles from internationally produced ones.
- 2** Sort the glass bottles by color (clear, brown, green).
- 3** Remove any caps, lids, or corks from the glass bottles.
- 4** Empty the bottles of any liquids or contents. Rinse them if necessary.
- 5** Avoid breaking the glass bottles, as shattered glass can pose safety risks
- 6** Pack in boxes or sacks for easier handling

PREFERRED GLASS

LOCAL GLASS BOTTLES (Most Recyclable)

- Softdrinks bottles,
- Alcoholic drink bottles
- Condiment bottles

 *Most likely reused directly by local producers and manufacturers*

OTHER GLASSES WE ACCEPT

CLEAR GLASS BOTTLES

Whole or broken, must be clean, without residue or stickers

Limited recyclability; may sometimes stop buying

CERAMIC & PORCELAIN

Dinnerware & kitchenware (mugs, plates, trays, cooking pots)

Home décor, figurines, statues, jars & pots, granite, jalousies, mirrors

Limited recyclability; may sometimes stop buying

ASSORTED GLASS BOTTLES

Includes condiment jars, skincare & makeup bottles, perfumes, medicine bottles

Limited recyclability; may sometimes stop buying

PULVERIZED GLASS, CERAMIC, OR PORCELAIN

Must be segregated per classification (white vs. colored)

Remove all stickers, labels, and residue before pulverizing

Store in reusable sacks for proper handling

Will be checked before sending
